Fashion Design I

Family & Consumer Sciences

Course Overview

Fashion Design I is a semester course teaching the basics of using a sewing machine to complete projects. After 3 simple projects, each student may choose projects. Students successfully completing this course with may take Fashion Design 2. There is a lab fee of \$10 (*see below*).

Students need to purchase & bring fabric, pattern, and notions for 3 projects.

Course Outline (Instructional Units)

1. Intro to course
2. Measuring & selecting correct pattern size
3. Mastering the sewing machine, (Parts & Threading)
4. Stitching and Seams
5. Understanding Patterns
6. Layout & Cutting Fabric
7. Marking the fabric
8. Sewing small pillow and equipment tote (materials provided)
9. Leisure pants, p.j.s, or boxers (student provides materials)
10. Projects of students' choice (student provided materials).

Expectations For Success & Safety

1. Be seated and ready (pencil and notebook, tote bin, etc.) before late bell.
2. Backpacks must be stowed in the designated area upon entering the room for everyone's safety.
3. Be kind and polite to everyone.
4. Listen when the teacher is speaking or it is someone else's turn to speak.
5. Turn in all assignments & projects on time. Late work will not be accepted (except for absences, *see below*). If you need extra time, see Mrs. Zell before you leave class.
6. Keep all returned papers.
7. Be seated at your assigned table while waiting for the bell after packing up & cleaning.
8. To protect our sewing machines NO gum, food or beverages in the room.
9. Student will be expected to clean up his/her table, machine, & floor each class.
10. **Have project materials to work on by 6th class.** (12th day of semester)
11. Keep text and evaluation sheet in your storage tray.
12. Use only your assigned machine unless you have teacher's verbal permission.
13. Work on your project each class. Be creative, have fun, try new things.

Make-up work

Will be posted each class. It is the **student's responsibility** to get & turn in work within 1 week of returning. Extended absences with Dr. note will be handled according to circumstances.

Students present in class must turn in daily drill that day to get credit.

Materials

A lab fee of \$10 will be collected by the teacher to purchase a kit of the equipment needed.

Students will be expected to have each day:

1. **Pencil /pen (blue or black)**

3. **notebook paper**
4. **evaluation sheet**

Grading

Everyone following the above expectations is guaranteed a 'C' or better on report card!

Grading will be on a point system, using standard percentages.

The first marking period will be approximately:

1. Homework 5% (Most homework will be shopping!)
2. Classwork 40% (Have a project to work on every class by the 6th class)
3. Projects 50%
4. Quizzes 5%
5. Quarterly Assessment 10%

The **Academic Integrity Policy** as stated in the Handbook will be enforced.

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- *Per AACPS regulation, students may redo up to four assessments and/or assignments each quarter. Students are encouraged, but not required, to participate in teacher-led reteaching. All redo items must be completed within ten days of receiving the original grade and may only be redone one time. The higher of the two grades will be used for calculating the student's quarter grade. The teacher may choose to have the student redo all of an assessment or assignment or may have student only redo specific items or parts of the work. Students may not redo homework, daily warm-ups, the quarterly assessment, or a large project. However, students may redo parts of a large project, if graded separately by the teacher, with each part counting as a separate redo. Assessments or assignments due in the last week of the quarter are not eligible.*
